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Regulations on the procedure for conducting self-assessment of accredited educational organizations

1. General provisions

- 1.1. These Regulations regulate the process of conducting self-assessment of accredited educational organizations and educational programs (EP) in order to internally assess the compliance of the activities of the EP/EP with the standards, criteria and rules of accreditation established by the Agency.
- 1.2. Self-assessment is the first stage of accreditation of the EP/EO and includes a comprehensive assessment of the effectiveness of the organization and/or the quality of educational programs.
- 1.3. The Regulation is aimed at:
 - ensuring an objective and transparent assessment of all aspects of the EO's activities and/or the quality of the OP;
 - improving the quality of the OP;
 - Promoting effective management of an educational organization.

2. Goals and objectives of self-assessment

- 2.1. The purpose of self-assessment is a comprehensive review of all components of educational activities in order to ensure compliance with the requirements of established standards and criteria.
- 2.2. Self-assessment tasks:
- assessment of the quality of educational programs and/or the effectiveness of educational institutions in accordance with accreditation standards and criteria;
- analysis of conditions for the implementation of educational programs (material and technical resources, human resources, financial stability);
- identification of problems and shortcomings in the organization of the educational process;
 - writing a self-assessment report.

3. Stages of self-assessment

- 3.1. Preparatory stage:
- appointment of a responsible person (group of persons) for conducting a self-assessment;

- Creation of a self-assessment commission, distribution of functions and standards among its members;
- Development of a self-assessment plan and timeline;
- collection of necessary documents and information about the activities of the educational organization;
- 3.2. Evaluation stage:
- conducting a thorough, evidence-based and self-critical self-assessment of the current state of the EO/EP;
- comparative analysis of current indicators with established norms, standards and recommendations;
- organization of consultations and questionnaires of students, teaching staff and other interested parties;
- 3.3. The stage of preparing the self-assessment report:
- writing the self-assessment report;
- Presentation of the educational organization's self-assessment report.
- discussion of the results of the self-assessment and correction of the self-report report of the EO/EP.

4. Aspects of self-assessment

- 4.1. Self-assessment is carried out according to established standards and criteria, paying special attention to the following aspects:
- Quality of educational programs: compliance of educational programs with state educational standards, the needs of students, employers and the labor market.
- The quality of the teaching staff: the qualifications of teachers, the availability of basic education, academic degrees and titles, advanced training
- The educational organization's infrastructure: accessibility and modernity of educational and laboratory facilities, availability of necessary equipment, technologies and information resources.
- Conditions for scientific and innovative activity: availability of scientific projects, publications, participation in international and national scientific conferences, forums.
- The results of educational activities: academic performance, employment of graduates, student participation in competitions and Olympiads.
- Organizational structure and management: quality of internal management, efficient use of resources and involvement in decision-making.

5. Documents and materials used for self-assessment

- 5.1. To conduct a self-assessment, the educational organization uses the following documents:
- AAEPO standards and criteria, state educational standards.
- Internal regulations of the educational organization (charter, regulations, instructions).
- Statistical data on the number of students and teachers.
- Minutes of meetings, reports, questionnaires, and research conducted in the educational organization.
- Reviews and opinions of external experts and employers.
- 5.2. All materials collected during the self-assessment process should be kept in the archive of the educational organization.

6. Content of the self-assessment report

- 6.1. The self-assessment report should include:
- assessment of the state of the EO/EO on standards and criteria of accreditation;
- Applications with evidence of compliance with standards and criteria;
- Identified strengths;
- Identified weaknesses.
- Self-assessment report signed by the members of the commission sent to the AAEPO.

7. Final provisions

- 7.1. The Regulation on the self-assessment of an educational organization is mandatory in preparation for accreditation.
- 7.2. If necessary, the Regulation may be amended or supplemented in accordance with changes in legislation and requirements of the accreditation bodies.
- 7.3. The Regulation comes into force from the moment of its approval and is valid until the adoption of a new document.
